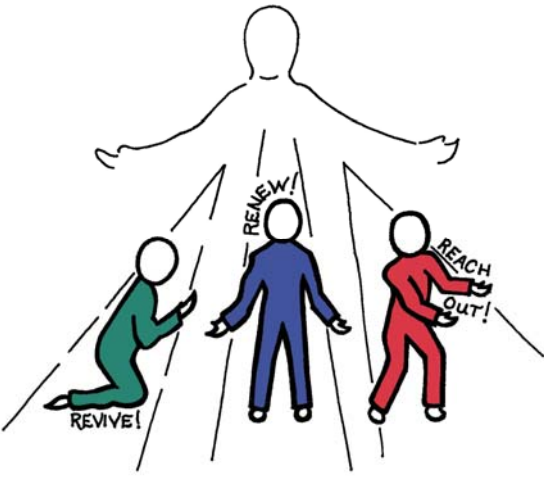

DOOR COUNTY

Take Hwy 57 South to Green Bay. Take Hwy 41 North, go 2 miles and exit onto Webster Avenue, turn left. Go to the 3rd set of traffic lights, which is Main Street, and turn right. We are 3 blocks on the right.

FOX VALLEY (APPLETON/OSHKOSH)

Take Hwy 41 North to Green Bay to Dousman Street, turn right, go 2 miles, continue over Fox River. Hotel 2 blocks on left.

MARINETTE/UPPER MICHIGAN

Take Hwy 41 or 141 South to Green Bay, take Interstate 43 South (Milwaukee exit). Go over the Fox River (large blue bridge), exit onto Webster Avenue and turn right. Go to the 3rd set of traffic lights, and turn right on Main Street. We are 3 blocks on the right side.

MADISON

Take Hwy 151 East to Fond du Lac. Take Hwy 41 North to Green Bay to Dousman Street, turn right, go 2 miles, continue over Fox River. Hotel 2 blocks on left.

STEVENS POINT

Take Hwy 54 East into Green Bay (Mason Street). Take the first exit after the Fox River (Madison Street), go 1 mile (one way, turns into two way, stay in right lane), and we are on the corner of Madison & Main Street.

MILWAUKEE & CHICAGO

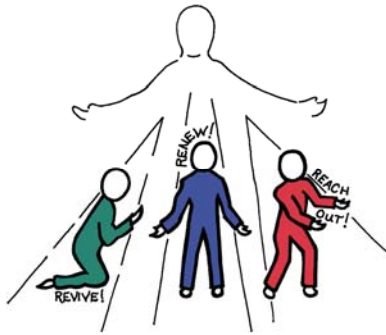
Take Interstate 94 West out of Chicago to Interstate 43 North in Milwaukee to Green Bay to Hwy 172 West. Take the Webster/Riverside Drive exit. Follow signs through lights to Riverside Drive, turn right on Riverside Drive. Go 2 miles (Riverside Drive turns into Monroe Avenue). Turn left on Main Street, and we are 1 block on the right.

MINNEAPOLIS/EAU CLAIRE

Take Hwy 29 into Green Bay (turns into Shawano Ave.). Turn left on Military Avenue (by McDonalds). Go 1 block, turn right on Dousman Street. Follow Dousman for 3 miles; go over the Fox River (Dousman turns into Main Street). We are 2 blocks on left side after the Fox River.

AUSTIN STRAUBEL AIRPORT (GRB)

Turn right out of airport onto Hwy 172, take Hwy 41 North exit. Follow Hwy 41 North to Dousman Street, turn right, go 2 miles, continue over Fox River. Hotel 2 blocks on left.

A Primer of Parliamentary Procedure

A. Purpose of Parliamentary Law and Procedure

The purpose of parliamentary procedure is to carry out the aims of the assembly in an orderly and fair manner, to expedite business, and to insure justice and fairness to all, both the majority and the minority.

It is not the purpose of parliamentary procedure to make the conduct of business in an assembly difficult, or to entangle an assembly in technicalities, or to provide a channel for individuals to flaunt their parliamentary knowledge.

Parliamentary law "embodies the basic principles of equal rights, the rule of the majority, the protection of the minority, and the orderly consideration of one subject at a time." (Clarence Cannon, Amer. Encl., Vol 21, p 228.)

B. Basic Steps of Parliamentary Procedure

The chairman and members of the assembly should be acquainted with and observe nine basic, essential parliamentary steps to take care of convention business in an orderly and fair manner. They are:

Members

1. Address the Chair: "Mr. Chairman" (or Mr. President).
2. Await recognition by the Chair.
3. Identify yourself thus: "I am the (pastoral/lay delegate from _____ congregation in _____."
4. Make the motion: "I move that ..."
5. Second the motion. (Unless not required)

Chair

6. States the motion (or rules it out of order).
7. Calls for discussion (unless motion is undebatable).
"Is there any discussion?" or "Are there any remarks?" Ample opportunity must always be given for expression of opinion and for discussion.
8. Takes the vote (or "puts the question").
First call for the affirmative vote, then the negative. "Those in favor of the motion say 'aye'; those opposed say 'no'." (A tie vote defeats the motion, since a majority is required to adopt – unless the motion requires a 2/3 vote.)
9. States the results.
"The 'ayes' have it and the motion is carried." OR, "The 'noes' have it and the motion is lost." The vote does not go into effect until the results are announced.

Special Standing Rules

(These rules are among those which prevail for conventions of the Synod.)

1. The chair shall see that the agenda is followed as closely as possible.
2. Each member of the convention, when recognized by the chair, shall state his/her name. He/she shall also state the name of his/her congregation and location, or of the administrative unit he/she represents.
3. Ordinarily, those who speak from the floor, shall limit their remarks to a two-minute-or-less (2 minutes) time period.
4. Any voting delegate may call the question at any time.
5. Instead of only a voice vote on motions before the convention, the chair shall ordinarily also call for the raising of the right hand.
6. If a substitute motion is offered, the convention shall first decide by majority vote whether or not to consider the substitute. If the decision is in the affirmative and the substitute motion is adopted, the original motion fails; if the substitute motion does not receive favorable action either to consider or to adopt, the original motion is again before the house. (This is the so-called "Behnken Rule" for dealing with substitute motions, as observed by the Synod.)
7. Resolutions prepared by the floor committee which are not acted upon by the convention before adjournment die.
8. Unless covered by these standing rules of the convention, parliamentary procedure shall be governed by "The Scott, Foresman *Robert's Rules of Order – Newly Revised*", copyright 1981. Above all, the rules of Christian love and behavior shall apply.

As a courtesy:

The use of sound-producing and voice-communication electronic devices shall not be permitted in the hall where the convention is being held.

Also, the use of sound-producing and electronic wire or wireless communication devices, including voice and data (e.g. laptops, messaging communication devices), shall not be permitted in the voting delegate section of the convention.

I bring you greetings from the Lutheran Laymen's League of North Wisconsin Upper Michigan District. In 1917 the Lutheran Church of Missouri, Ohio and other states had a mounting debt of \$100,000 (about \$2 million today). Twelve laymen pledged \$26,000 to alleviate synod's debt, plus a \$1000 individual pledge. By December that goal was reached and exceeded by \$5000. This was the beginning of the Lutheran Laymen's League.

Having liquidated synodical debt the League decided to accumulate a permanent endowment fund for the support of retired or invalid professors, pastors and teachers and provide for widows and orphans of deceased servants of the Word. To accomplish this, the League presented about \$2.7 million to synod.

On Thursday Oct. 2, 1930 at 10 PM the first Lutheran Hour Broadcast went on the air. Since then God has blessed this ministry with faithful and willing workers into a network of 880 stations in 44 different countries around the entire world.

Television became a popular communication medium in the late 1940's when a Lutheran Hour broadcast featured Dr. Walter A Maier on New Years Day and another on Good Friday in 1948.

In 1975, the LCMS asked the Lutheran Laymen's League to accept sole responsibility for Lutheran Television, and in 1979 this was accomplished.

Dedicated professional workers, along with the league members and many donors and sponsors, have kept this ministry proclaiming the good news of Jesus throughout the world.

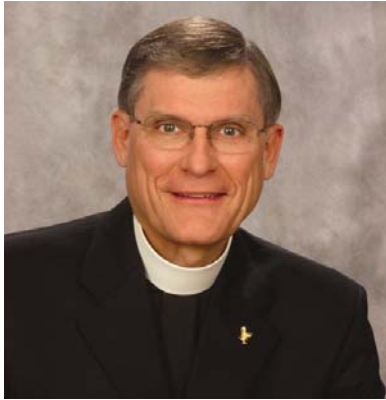
Rev. Dr. Terry Tieman

Rev. Dr. Terry Tieman is the President & Executive Director of Transforming Churches Network (TCN). He also serves as the National Director of Mission Revitalization for the LCMS. Dr. Tieman's vision for the LCMS is to help transform plateaued and declining churches into revitalized congregations that regularly and consistently "make new disciples who make new disciples."

TCN was developed to provide training and resources to help congregations fulfill their role as "mission outposts." TCN is a non-profit partner organization of The Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod dedicated to revitalizing churches. The purpose of TCN is to assist the LCMS in reaching its **Ablaze!** goal of revitalizing 2,000 churches by 2017. Currently, there are over 250 churches in the Transforming Churches Network.

Prior to his current ministry with TCN, Dr. Tieman served as Mission Executive for the Mid-South District for 13 years. Pastor Tieman's 20/20 Vision for the Mid-South District resulted in over 100 new ministries being established, including over 25 new congregations. Rev. Tieman was a parish pastor for 12 years in Michigan and Arkansas, where he also planted two new congregations. He has led numerous seminars on church planting and evangelism around the United States, Canada, Cuba, and Africa.

Terry and his wife, Becky, live in Memphis, Tennessee, and are members of Immanuel Lutheran Church. Becky is a former Lutheran School Teacher. She is currently an instructor in the Intensive English for International Students Department at the University of Memphis.



Meet Our President

Rev. Dr. Gerald B. Kieschnick

The Rev. Dr. Gerald B. Kieschnick was elected to his third three-year term as president of the 2.45-million-member Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod in July 2007, an office in which he has served his Lord and Church since September 2001. His vision for The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod is summarized as **One Mission – One Message – One People**, which he expounds, as follows: “Our **One Mission** is to seek the lost for Christ by communicating the **One Message** that Jesus Christ is the Savior of the world as **One People** united by God's love in Jesus Christ.”

Just prior to becoming LCMS president, Kieschnick had been president of the Synod's Texas District for 10 years. He also served that district as a circuit counselor from 1978-81 and as director of public relations from 1977-86. Prior to his Texas District presidency, Kieschnick was director of development of the Lutheran Foundation of Texas from 1986-88 and then served as its executive director from 1988-91.

From 1998 until his election as LCMS president, Kieschnick chaired the LCMS Commission on Theology and Church Relations, and served on the executive committee of the LCMS Council of Presidents.

Born in Houston on January 29, 1943, Kieschnick attended Texas A&M University, graduating with a Bachelor of Science degree in 1964. He is a 1970 graduate of Concordia Theological Seminary, Springfield, IL, obtained his Master of Divinity degree in 1977 from Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, IN, and received an honorary Doctor of Laws degree in 1996 from Concordia University, Austin, TX.

After his ordination in 1970, Kieschnick served as pastor of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, Biloxi, MS, until 1973; pastor of Redeemer Lutheran Church, Beaumont, TX, 1973-81; and mission developer and pastor of Faith Lutheran Church, Georgetown, TX, 1981-86.

Dr. Kieschnick and his wife of 44 years, Terry, have two grown children, Andrew Kieschnick and Angela (husband Todd) Keith and two grandchildren, Kolby and Kayla Keith — all of whom live in Texas.
